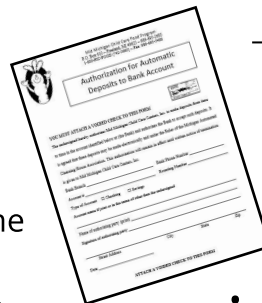
Why not pair this up with a vegetable of the day and then discuss the texture, color, health benefits and more as part of your daily lesson plans?!
